

What is...

THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN THE MX8 & MX12

The MX8, designed in 1968 for the Mexico Olympics, started as a true Competition gun and has proved the most successful in the history of competitive trap shooting. The MX8, MX8-20, MX2000/8 and all the engraved versions of the same action feature a single selective detachable trigger mechanism, normally fitted with V – springs although coil springs are also an option.

On a standard gun the trigger is non- selective and usually fires bottom barrel first. Firing sequence can be reversed if required and a barrel selector, fitted behind the trigger but within the trigger guard, is available as an optional extra.

Perazzi MX12, designed in 1987, was conceived as a Hunting and Sporting gun with a single selective non-detachable trigger system fitted with coil springs. Using the same action and trigger system are the MX20, MX2000S and the engraved versions of the MX12. The MX28 & MX410 use a true scaled down version of the MX12 action.

Both action bodies are the same size and shape and share many of the same parts. Both have the famed Perazzi barrel locking system, barrels are interchangeable, and to all intents and purposes the only difference is in the trigger system.

Because of the extra width needed for the detachable trigger system it does mean that the stocks are not interchangeable between the MX8 & MX12 derivative actions.
